About Dylan Foley

Dylan Foley, from Highland, New York has attended Father Charlie Coen's Irish music sessions at the Rhinecliff Hotel and the American Legion Hall in Rhinebeck, with his parents since he was four years old. Dylan started violin lessons at eight and began studying with Irish fiddler Rose Conway Flanagan of Pearl River, New York. Rose is an original member of the acclaimed New York-based Irish music/singing group Cherish the Ladies. In 2004, Dylan placed third in the Mid-Atlantic Regional Irish Music Competitions (Fleadh), and then took First place at the All-Ireland Fleadh Cheoil in the Under-12 solo fiddle category. In 2005, Dylan placed first in the regional and then traveled to Donegal, where he placed first again, this time in the 12-15 category. Then in 2008, Dylan went over again to the All-Ireland's and won again in the 15-18 category. "Dylan's rhythm, ornamentation, and intonation on the fiddle are simultaneously impeccable and spirited."

Dylan has quickly become known as a skilled performer in his own right. Dylan has played on Jay Unger's Dancing On the Air show on WAMC four times. He has also performed with the John Whelan Band, Joanie Madden, Brian Conway, Mike McHale, Monsignor Charlie Coen, Dan Gurney to name a few. He has also performed at the Catskills Irish Arts Week, Elkins Irish Week, the Anchorage Folk Festival and has taught at the O'Flaherty Irish Music Retreat and O'Flaherty Irish Music Youth Camp. He runs a monthly session at the Dubliner Irish Pub. These days, Dylan is very busy performing and playing ceili's as well as contra dances, and sessions in the NY area.

About Patrick Doocey

Patrick Doocey is quickly becoming one of the most in demand accompanists on the Irish music scene today. Predominately self taught on guitar, Patrick's exciting style on both nylon and steel string guitar combines influences from many genres. Born in Worcester, Massachusetts and having lived in Foxford, County Mayo, Patrick now resides in New York City. His talents have brought him all over Europe, Asia, America and Africa. His musical journey so far has seen him perform with artists such as Sharon Shannon, Liz Carroll, Lunasa, Mary Chapin Carpenter, Teada, Buille, Cathal Hayden, Karan Casey, and Sean Keane.
